No education for tribal children? Changing Educational Landscape in Uttarakhand

Only 72.5% of children in classes 3 to 5 can read at a basic level, and just 54.8% can do simple math. Many schools lack computers, internet, and enough teachers, making learning a real challenge, especially for tribal children and girls.

Samanta Foundation is changing this. Working in remote areas of Uttarakhand and Uttar Pradesh, they focus on marginalized communities, including forest dwellers and tribal groups. Through their Whole School Transformation initiative, they aim to provide quality education to 10,000 children by 2027, ensuring no child is left behind.

Their work supports SDG 4 - Quality Education and SDG 5 - Gender Equality, making education a tool for empowerment.
